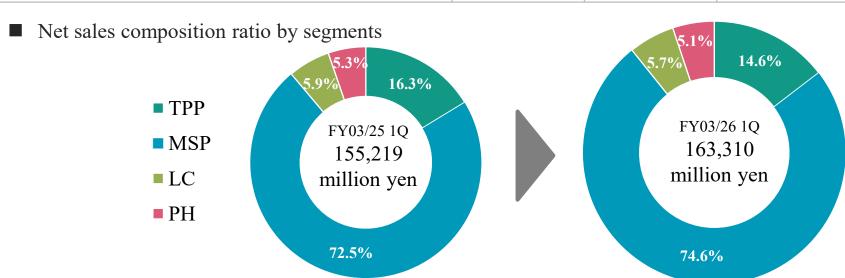

Start operation of newly contracted SPD facilities (2 cases/approx.400 beds) in the FY03/26. Initiation of a bundled contract with multiple hospitals under different management bodies.

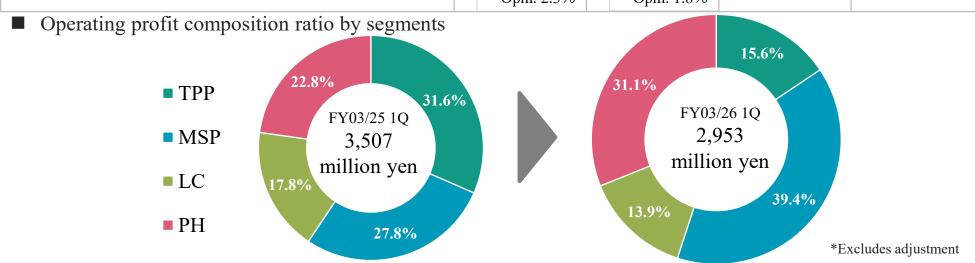

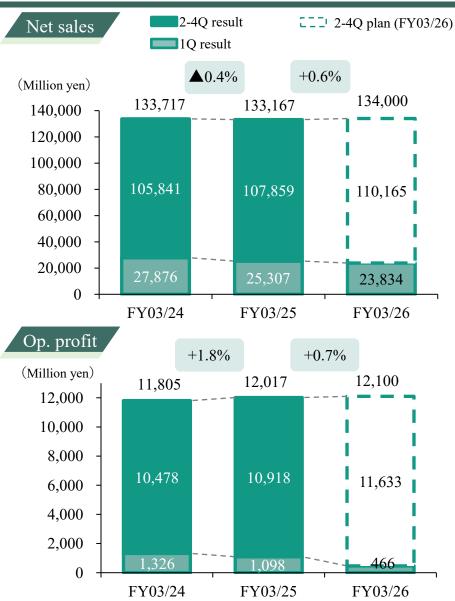

- An ODA related company joined the Group.

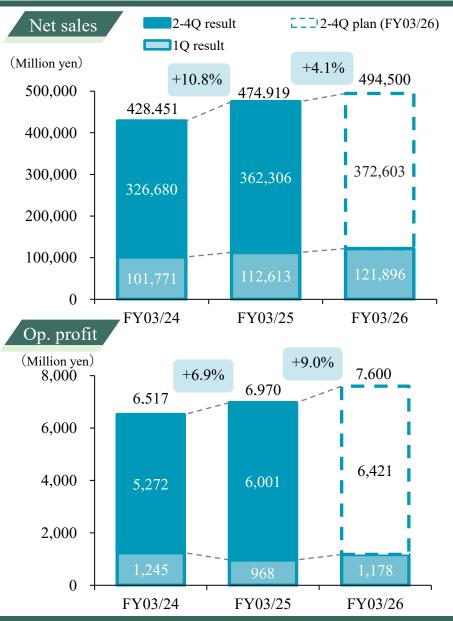
Negative aspects

Positive aspects

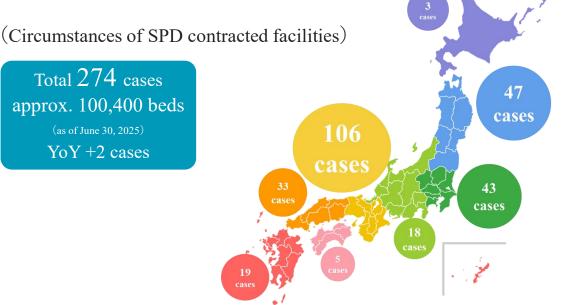
- Initiation of a bundled contract with multiple hospitals under different management bodies.

Surge in purchase price and raise in labor costs / dispatch expenses.

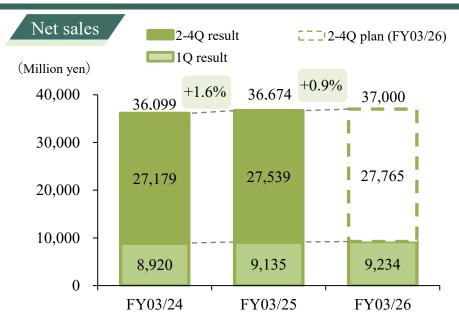

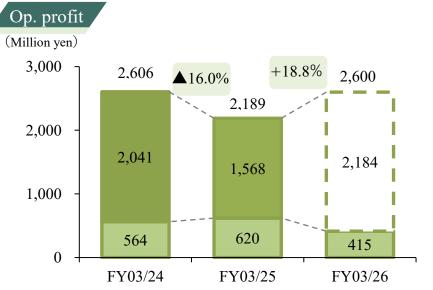
YoY +2 cases

Negative aspects

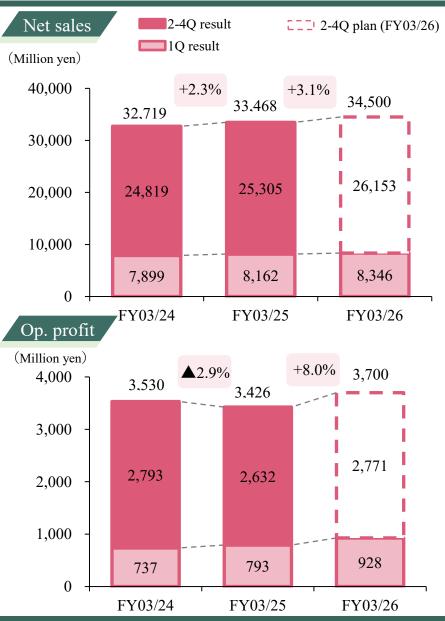
- [Nursing care] Record of upfront expenses associated with new facility opening

- Participation of Tec International Inc., an ODA-Focused Trading Company.
- Engages in the sale and import/export of medical and related equipment, creating synergy with the group's trading functions.
 - (Ex.) Setthathirath Hospital and Champasak Province Hospital Improvement Project in the Lao PDR



- Projects aimed at improving the services and environment of the Setthathirath Hospital and Champasak Hospital, which serve as regional core hospitals in in Laos.
- The group has undertaken the installation and training for CT systems (computerized tomography systems), X-ray imaging systems, and other medical equipment.

(Ex.) Sunrise Japan Hospital in Cambodia (Emergency and Critical Care Development Project)



- This hospital specializes in emergency and critical care, providing high-quality medical services equivalent to those in Japan
- This hospital follows Japanese hospital export model from construction and equipment delivery to operation. The group has handled comprehensive operations, including the delivery of medical equipment and training.

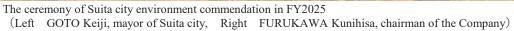
